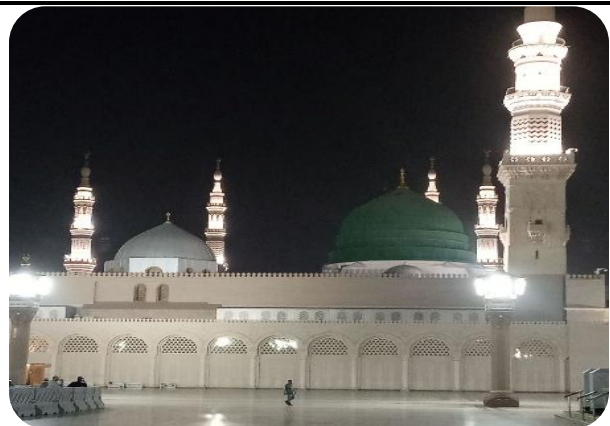

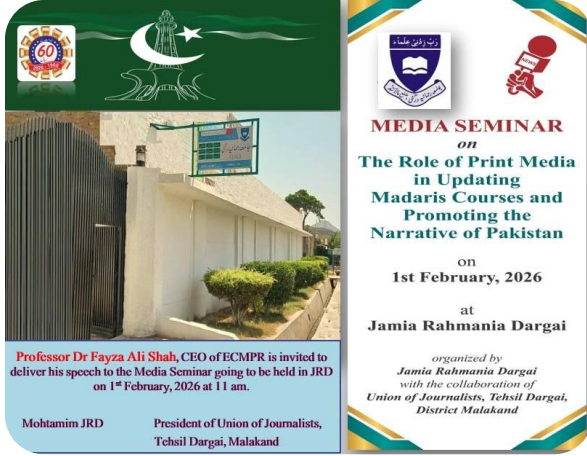

#### **14. New Solar Policy: A Step Backward for Pakistan’s Energy Future? (12<sup>th</sup> February 2026).**

Pakistan’s shift from net-metering to net-billing may appear technical — but its impact is deeply economic, social, and strategic.

For years, ECMPR has actively campaigned for solarization in Pakistan, particularly advocating rooftop solar as a market-driven solution to:

- Reduce unbearable electricity costs
- Revive struggling industries (including KP’s marble sector)
- Protect small businesses
- Promote energy independence
- Advance environmental sustainability

The new policy, which reduces the financial viability of rooftop solar for future adopters, risks slowing down this positive momentum. Let’s be clear:

- The core problem of Pakistan’s power sector is not solar users.
- The real issues are line losses, electricity theft, inefficiencies, circular debt, and poor governance.

Penalizing citizens who invested their savings in clean energy is not structural reform — it sends the wrong signal to households, entrepreneurs, and investors.

We appreciate the Prime Minister's direction to protect existing users. However, protecting only current consumers is not enough. Pakistan needs a forward-looking, pro-solar, pro-consumer, pro-market energy framework — not regulatory uncertainty.

Solarization is not a luxury. It is a necessity for:

### **25. Protect Livelihoods from the Ripple Effect of Fuel Prices (7<sup>th</sup> March 2026)**

The Experts Centre for Market and Policy Research (ECMPR) expresses serious concern over the recent massive increase in petrol prices in Pakistan.

The government has linked this hike to the current regional situation and indicated that prices will be reduced once international oil prices decline and the war situation stabilizes. However, the immediate impact of this sharp increase will be a surge in the prices of essential commodities,

placing additional pressure on households and small businesses. Experience shows that while petrol prices may decrease later, the prices of other commodities rarely return to previous levels once they rise, leaving families and small businesses to bear the long-term burden.

In response, ECMPR has decided to launch a campaign aimed at protecting households and small businesses from the permanent economic shocks caused by repeated fuel price hikes. Through this initiative, ECMPR will engage different segments of society, traders, academics, and civil society to highlight the ripple effects of fuel price increases and encourage collective advocacy for sustainable economic policies.

Consistent with the mission of ECMPR, the campaign will advocate market-based solutions that safeguard the economic freedom of households, reduce the operational burden on small businesses, and encourage policies that promote competition, innovation, and long-term economic stability. ECMPR believes that protecting livelihoods and ensuring economic stability are essential steps toward a more prosperous and resilient Pakistan.

Such hikes not only affect transportation costs but also create a ripple effect that impacts households, small businesses, and essential services. When fuel prices rise, the burden ultimately falls on ordinary families and small entrepreneurs who are already struggling with inflation.

Through its campaign, ECMPR continues to highlight the long-term economic and social consequences of repeated fuel price shocks and calls on policymakers to adopt sustainable policies that protect households and small businesses from these recurring crises. The current disruptions in the education sector are yet another reminder that the impact of fuel price hikes goes far beyond the pump—it affects the stability of our entire society.

## **28. Rising Fuel Prices, Rising Pressures: A Policy Moment for Pakistan (10<sup>th</sup> March 2026)**

The recent increase in petrol prices is more than a routine adjustment—it is a signal of deeper structural challenges in Pakistan's economy. Higher fuel costs quickly ripple through transportation, food prices, and small business operations, placing a disproportionate burden on low- and middle-income households.

For entrepreneurs, daily wage earners, and small traders, rising fuel prices mean higher operating costs and shrinking margins. For citizens, it means increased inflation and reduced purchasing power.

The recent decision of the government to deduct 5–30% from the salaries of employees to cover the losses caused by the petroleum price hike is another drastic and unjustified burden on citizens who are already struggling under the weight of heavy taxation and rising inflation.

This step will further worsen the financial condition of salaried individuals whose purchasing power has already been severely affected by increasing fuel prices and the resulting rise in the cost of essential commodities. Instead of providing relief, such measures make life even more difficult for a class that is already contributing significantly to the national exchequer.

The Experts Centre for Market and Policy Research (ECMPR) once again expresses serious concern over this decision and urges policymakers to reconsider policies that place additional pressure on ordinary citizens. Sustainable and fair policy solutions are urgently needed to address the recurring petroleum price shocks without transferring the burden to households and working professionals.

Through its ongoing campaign for a sustainable petroleum policy, ECMPR continues to advocate for long-term, market-based solutions that can protect individual consumers and small businesses from the day-to-day increase in petroleum prices and their cascading effects on the economy. Protecting livelihoods and ensuring economic stability must remain at the center of policymaking.

We are grateful to Principal, Mr.Aslam for his warm welcome and commitment to nurturing responsible and confident young learners.

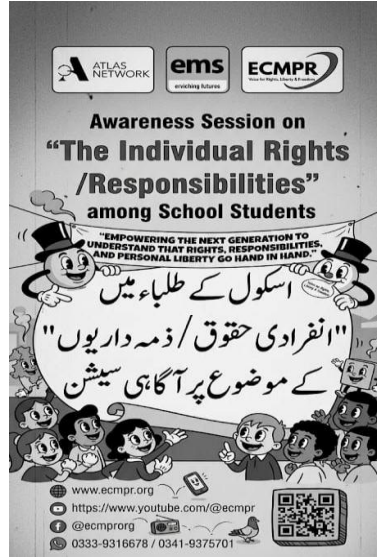
